

## Quality Framework

*Policy Code: CG1700*

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### Purpose

Federation University Australia is committed to quality across its federated network of campuses and partner-provider institutions and will achieve the statutory quality standards of its regulatory bodies through a system of compliance auditing.

The University will provide a quality tertiary education experience that inspires its students to succeed, serves its regions and communities and is international in its outlook and impact.

### Scope

This policy applies to all organisational units, all staff and all functions of the University, inclusive of the entire University community including students and partners of the University located locally, interstate or overseas.

| Benchmarking                  | The process of measuring and monitoring outcomes against predetermined (usually best practice) standards   |

| Council                       | The Council is the governing authority of the University and is responsible for the direction and superintendence of the University  |

Under the Act, the decision making powers of the University lie with Council as its governing body, Academic Board and the Vice-Chancellor. The University is responsible to comply with the statutory requirements as listed under Legislative Context.

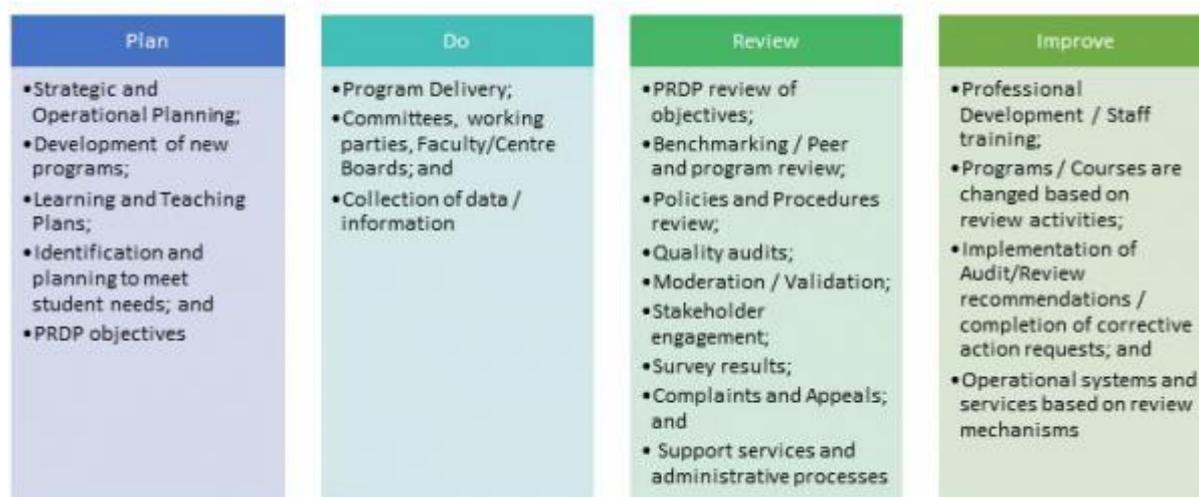
## Quality Cycle - Continuous Improvement
